How about that nearly 10% of Connecticut youth ages 12-17 have used illicit drugs in the past month?²

Those statistics are alarming! That's why Milford Prevention Council (MPC) is so critical to our community. MPC has helped our kids and families for years. Now MPC needs YOUR help so it can keep helping Milford!

Since 2009, MPC has worked hard to reduce underage drinking and substance use in our community. We provide programs that help families understand the risks and avoid the pitfalls of substance use. We work with the Milford Police Department and many other community organizations to promote prevention programs.

Our work has produced amazing results. A 64% decrease in alcohol use among 7th, 9th and 11th graders. A 33% decrease in cigarette use. And among high school students, 30-day use rates for alcohol and marijuana are 24% and 16% below state averages, respectively.³

The data shows that MPC programs are working. We hear it from both children and parents alike. Now, as a business owner in our community, we ask you to **join us** in sustaining these much-needed programs.

"We are speaking up because it breaks the stigma," says Milford resident Kim Burrows and her teenage daughters Hope and Lia. "If just one person talks about the need to prevent substance use, it starts many other people talking."

The Burrows family lost Jessica – a daughter, sister and college student – to a heroin overdose at 25. They became committed to raise awareness and make a difference. Hope and Lia organized a fundraiser for MPC through their Foran High School lacrosse team. The proceeds went to MPC to help raise awareness for substance use and MPC's programs.

"MPC worked with us to mold a program that fit our purpose," the family adds. "Prevention is in MPC's name. It takes the weight off when parents and kids talk about these issues. What MPC does has a lasting impact."

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It is more than just one family who is stepping forward. We know that business owners are impacted by substance use also. It can affect your families, employees and customers.
